## Our programmes

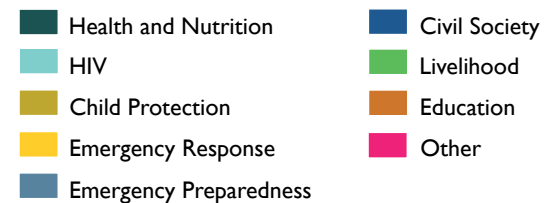
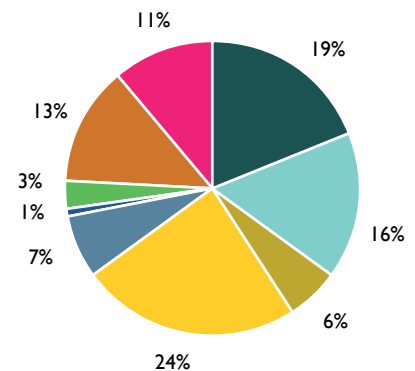

We work alongside the government and other stakeholders to achieve the Millennium Development Goals and to support national socio-economic development plans and strategies.

This means :

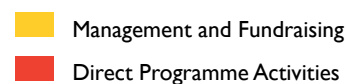
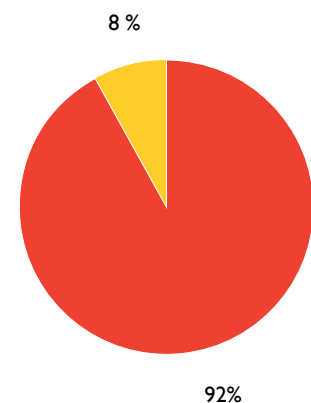
- More children live to their 5th birthday
- A reduction in the number of children and families living in extreme poverty
- Ensuring all children have enough healthy and nutritious food to eat
- All children receive and access quality preschool and primary education
- Children are protected from violence, abuse, and exploitation
- Children are safe when disaster hits

## Proven and measurable Impact

- In 2009 we worked directly with 103,000 children and helped 2 million children indirectly
- We directly help 364,527 children get a better education
- Through our nutrition work we supported 698,449 children to get a healthy start in life
- We improved the health care of 85,084 children through our health & HIV programmes
- We helped ensure that 43,839 children were kept safe from neglect, abuse and exploitation
- We distributed immediate living saving relief and helped over 100,000 people to rebuild their lives after the Ketsana and Mirianie storms.
